KEY POINTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS

1. TEAM:

Have a solid team to help you run the event (ie course marking crew, scoring crew, promo crew, sponsorship crew, registration crew, etc.).

2. COURSE MAP AND MARKINGS:

Print course map for each group (with all mandos, OBs, DZs and other rules for each hole).

OB lines are best when clearly marked and visible from the teebox (and roped or stringed and flagged).

Make sure course markings exactly match the printed course map (e.g. send out groups to play the marked/mapped course before the event, to report issues).

3. TIMING:

Open registration at least 2 months out from your event?

Stick as close to advertised timings as possible. Test the playing time for an average group (especially if the course is new), and add a margin for delays and back-ups.

Make every effort to finish the event and prize giving on schedule (to avoid disruption to players who have flights to catch or who are driving long distance).

4. SCORING:

Encourage groups to use the PDGA live scoring app (pdga.com/score) with manual paper backup. This saves data-entry and time, and is likely to have fewer errors.

The new NZDG policy is to treat the confirmed digital scorecard as the player's official score.

Make sure groups who have not used the PDGA scoring app report this to the scoring crew when handing in their cards.

5. WATER AND FOOD:

Provide water stations evenly spaced around the course (https://www.pdga.com/files/2020_pdga_tour_standards.pdf)

Include lunch of decent quality in the registration cost for at least one of the days of your event (ideally for all days). Allow players to opt out of lunch when registering. If the tournament location is remote, include lunch for all days.

If cold weather is anticipated, consider providing hot food and drinks. If hot weather is anticipated, consider providing ice. Provide shelter for players!

6. RULINGS:

- (a) At the first players meeting, emphasise that the group is the primary arbiter, and that all players are obliged to watch all shots.
- (b) Have at least 2 certified rules officials (other than the TD) to whom groups should refer rules disputes in the first instance.
- (c) Take the dispute to the TD only if not resolved.
- (d) Take the dispute to the NZDG Tour Director if still not resolved.
- (e) Take the dispute to the PDGA Country Co-ordinator (Simon Feasey) if still not resolved.

(f) The NZDG Tour Director or PDGA Country Co-ordinator will take the matter to the PDGA if necessary (though this is expected to be rare). TDs should not approach the PDGA directly for rulings.

7. PROMOTION:

Consider a well planned promotional lead up at least 8 weeks out from your event (with consecutive social media posts and the provision of printed posters on the course/s).

Consider radio and local newspaper articles.

If possible publish player registrations as they arrive on the PDGA event site.

8. SETTING THE TONE:

The tone of the TD's address at the first players meeting has a big impact on how players behave (for example in relation to smoking, alcohol, drugs, speed of play, behaviour on and off the course). Set the right tone from the start!

9. WHEN THE PARTY'S OVER:

- (a) Clean-up so as to leave everything in an even better state than before. Players will willingly help, but they need to be asked.
- (b) Pay your NZDG levies i.e. \$7 per player to NZDG

- (c) Complete and submit the PDGA tournament manager report if your event is PDGA sanctioned.
- (d) Thank all your crew and sponsors.
- (e) Post any photos and or video of your event on social media.

** We recommend seeking local radio sponsorship for your event so as to provide multiple free radio spots for your principal sponsor which maybe quite attractive to them **

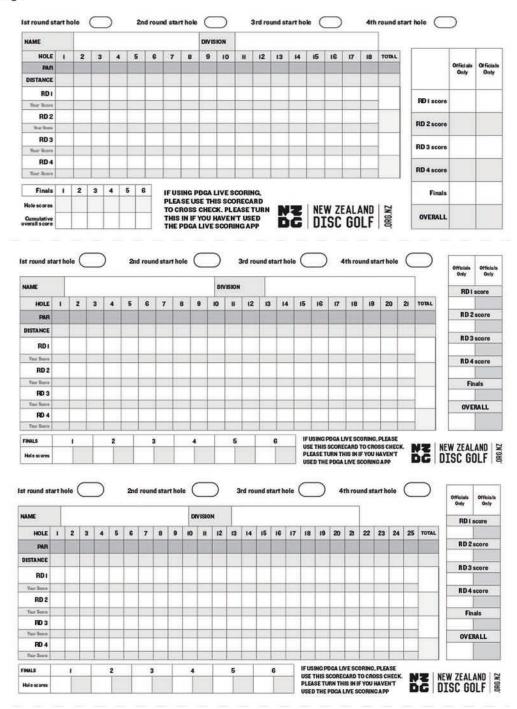
