Entity's Purpose:

To support and encourage the growth and development of disc golf throughout New Zealand.

Entity's Vision:

To establish the right conditions for disc golf in New Zealand to realise its full potential, improving the health and well-being of many New Zealanders, their families and communities.

Entity Structure:

The New Zealand Disc Golf Association (NZDG) is the national governing body of the sport of disc golf in New Zealand. The organisation is a not for profit incorporated society.

NZDG is a membership organisation that operates under a constitution with a membership elected Board of Directors. A Non-Executive Committee is appointed as required to undertake board assigned tasks.

Annual membership is subscribed to individual disc golfers that play in a NZDG sanctioned tournament during a calendar year. Local disc golf clubs in NZ are affiliated to NZDG.

NZDG is affiliated to the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) and the World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF).

Main Sources of the Entity's Cash and Resources:

Levies are charged on individual NZDG sanctioned tournament registration fees. These levies constitute NZDG membership revenue.

Commercial sponsorship is sought and fundraising events undertaken to assist in running tournaments in NZ and in sending our national team to tournaments overseas.

Other funding has been granted by public trusts and invested in disc golf courses.

Chairperson's Report:

The 2020 Disc Golf season had some unexpected pitfalls, but on the positive side we saw continued growth across the country. Thank you to all the returning and new members to our association. Thank you to the tournament directors and event sponsors throughout the season. I would also like to thank all those that have volunteered time with NZDG over the year. With a special thank you to Mat Prichard for standing as appointed Chairperson after Paul Deacon's decision to step down.

The tour continues to have a strong participation at events. With an increase of new members from 356 playing members to 433 playing members. We saw fewer events on tour down from 20 to 17. Thank you to the Dunedin Club for holding and running an amazing national tournament. To Queenstown Disc Golf Club for holding the South Island Championship, and for the first time on tour the Inglewood group for holding the North Island Championships. Match Play was held at Bella Raka again and thank you for all involved.

We look to continued growth in the next year with more courses being developed across the country. The board will continue to work on governance procedures to support the association members. I encourage all of you to be as active as you can be in your region or on a national level by standing for office.

Treasurer's Report:

New Zealand Disc Golf reports an annual surplus for the year ended 31 December 2020 of \$976. Although there were fewer tournaments held in 2020, there were more players at those tournaments which generated additional revenue.

With the Flying Kiwis not travelling in 2020, the corresponding sponsorship revenue and expenditure was not received or incurred. Several software improvements were made in the latter part of 2020 to enhance the security and reliability of the organisation's information systems.

Legal fees were incurred in 2020 to trademark the NZDG logo and to protect the New Zealand Disc Golf brand for the future. The Trademark has been recorded as an intangible asset. The website was revamped in 2020 and recorded as an intangible asset to be reduced in value over the next four years by amortisation expense.

As at 31 December 2020 the association had \$47,044 in its bank accounts. This figure is exaggerated by \$31,871 of successful grants and donations requested for the Spa Park course installation project in Taupo. Thank you to Pub Charity, TAB, Lion Foundation and Southern Trust for their generosity and commitment to growing our great game. The grants are recorded as a liability at 31 December 2020 and were paid to the course installers upon the project completion in April 2021.

Therefore uncommitted cash on hand at 31 December 2020 was \$15,173 which is an encouraging financial position for NZDG. Previous years' board members should be commended for achieving such a stable foundation to assist the growth of our sport in 2021.

Additional Output Measures:

Surveys indicate that there are circa 50 recreational players for every tournament player. Extrapolated, this suggests that there were at least 18,000 total players in 2019, and at least 21,000 players in 2020. An approximate growth rate of 20 percent, based on conservative estimates. Other measures suggest faster growth.

NZDG plans to countinue assisting UDisc with their counting surveys in 2021 to more accurately quantify how we are performing against our purpose and vision.

Basis of Preparation

New Zealand Disc Golf Association has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

New Zealand Disc Golf Association is not registered for GST. Therefore amounts recorded in the Performance Report are inclusive of GST (if any).

Income Tax

New Zealand Disc Golf Association is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

INDEPENDED REVIEW REPORT

Report on New Zealand Disc Golf Association Financial Statements

I have reviewed the accompanying 31 December 2020 financial statements of New Zealand Disc Golf Association, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2020, and the statement of financial performance, and statement of cash flows for the 12 months ended on that date, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

The Responsibility of the Members of the Committee for the 12 Months Financial Statements

The members of the committee are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the XRB, PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not For Profit) reporting requirements and for such internal controls as the members determine are necessary to enable the preparation of the 12 months financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

My Responsibility

My responsibility is to express a conclusion on the 12 months financial statements based on my review.

A review of 12 months financial statements in accordance with NZ SRE 2410 is a limited assurance engagement. The reviewer performs procedures, primarily consisting of main enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly I do not express an audit opinion on those financial statements.

Furthermore the user should not assume that the reviewers report is an assurance as to the future viability of the entity, nor an opinion as to the efficiency and effectiveness with which the members have conducted the affairs of New Zealand Disc Golf Association.
