#### **Entity's Purpose:**

To support and encourage the growth and development of disc golf throughout New Zealand.

### **Entity's Vision:**

To establish the right conditions for disc golf in New Zealand to realise its full potential, improving the health and well-being of many New Zealanders, their families and communities.

## **Entity Structure:**

The New Zealand Disc Golf Association (NZDG) is the national governing body of the sport of disc golf in New Zealand. The organisation is a not for profit incorporated society.

NZDG is a membership organisation that operates under a constitution with a membership elected Board of Directors. A Non-Executive Committee is appointed as required to undertake board assigned tasks.

Annual membership is subscribed to individual disc golfers that play in a NZDG sanctioned tournament during a calendar year. Local disc golf clubs in NZ are affiliated to NZDG.

NZDG is affiliated to the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) and the World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF).

## Main Sources of the Entity's Cash and Resources:

Levies are charged on individual NZDG sanctioned tournament registration fees. These levies constitute NZDG membership revenue.

Commercial sponsorship is sought and fundraising events undertaken to assist in running tournaments in NZ and in sending our national team to tournaments overseas.

Other funding has been granted by public trusts and invested in disc golf courses.

## Chairperson's Report:

What a year it has been. From an interim board to special general meetings, to the largest tournaments that New Zealand Disc Golf has ever seen, 2022/2023 have been years to remember. Over the past 12 months, the NZDG Tour has featured 23 events with over 700 individual players. In that time 2,300 individual entries were registered at events with an average of 100 players competing at any given event.

The board worked diligently over the last year to provide additional value to the membership with most of that value found in the financial support given back to tournament directors and traveling players. \$3,000 worth of travel grants were awarded to eligible players up and down the country, and an additional \$3,000 was awarded as part of the newly established NZDG TD Fund, which was established to help ease the financial burden on TDs running NZDG events.

The fund can be broken down into two initiatives, TD Grants and Media Grants. TD Grants allow event directors to apply for up to \$250 to offset tournament costs, and \$500 Media Grants are designed to help directors get better media coverage at NZDG events. The board also increased our output of communications. The "Inside Line" monthly newsletter was created, as well as regular Facebook and Instagram posts before and after each event.

As the organisation progresses over the next 12 months we expect to see further growth in event attendance, more than 100 disc golf courses in New Zealand, and even tougher competition for those who wish to walk away a National or Tour Champion. On behalf of the NZDG Board of Directors, we thank you all for making our organisation what it is today.

## **Basis of Preparation**

New Zealand Disc Golf Association has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

## Goods and Services Tax (GST)

New Zealand Disc Golf Association is not registered for GST. Therefore amounts recorded in the Performance Report are inclusive of GST (if any).

## **Income Tax**

New Zealand Disc Golf Association is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

## **Bank Accounts and Cash**

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.
